# Beacon Hill Governing Board – April 21, 2021 Principal's report

**Registration –** Presently registered 273 students for next year. We will have two classes at each level except at K4.

**Staffing** – Mme Linda Perron will be retiring at the end of this year.

We had our first case of COVID-19 at Beacon Hill.

• Class was online for two weeks but have returned to school this week. In all future cases DRSP will be treating it as a variant case

**Media Smarts** gave virtual presentations to the students in Cycles 1, 2 and 3. The themes depended on the age of the students.

#### Grades 1 and 2:

- What they see in the media can be deceptive.
- The importance of written and unwritten rules when playing and learning together online and offline.
- Finding a healthy balance between physical, quiet time and media activities.

## Grades 3 and 4

- What is real and what is fake online and steps to verify online information.
- Discussed the concept of empathy and looked at ways in which digital communication can make it harder to feel empathy for other people.

## Grades 5 and 6

- Helped students to make safe and ethical decisions online and identify strategies and supports that are available to assist them with issues they may encounter online.
- Explore their legal rights online.

**Wellness initiative using mesure money** – Kind Kids By Epique for grade1 students. Students will learn:

- Emotional awareness
- Self-regulation
- Skills in sharing and inclusive play
- How to manage frustration and anger
- How to say sorry and forgive

The Council of Commissioners of the Lester B. Pearson School Board unanimously approved a contract
of \$6 484 525 (before taxes) to 3 Axes Construction Inc. for the Lindsay Place High School Project for
science labs and locker room renovations as well as classroom optimization work. The awarding of the
contract follows a favorable recommendation made on April 14th 2021 by the Facilities and Security
Committee.
