### 4.1 Principal

The office has been getting ready for next year. We currently have 283 students registered for next year. We will have 2 classes at each level.

All the staff from region 1 attended a workshop on Monday, March $28^{\text {th }}$ : Uncovering Change: Towards a Collective Collaborating Community presentation by Delia Noel and Wissam Assouad.

Region 1 has a new Regional Director - Kathleen O'Reilly. We wish Debi Dixon the best in her new role as Regional Director for Region 3.
The second round of Interim report cards were sent out April $14^{\text {th }}$.
The Our School Survey results were sent out to all teachers. I had the opportunity to go and visit each class to share and discuss the results with the students. It was very enlightening to have the conversations as to why certain results came in as they did. The students were very comfortable and were eager participants.

Kindergarten teachers will be filling out surveys regarding Child Development in Kindergarten April $7^{\text {th }}$ and April $8^{\text {th }}$. This is a survey that takes place across Quebec.

The K4 and K5 will be holding an in-person orientation day on the June $3^{\text {rd }}$ Beacon Hill Ped Day in the morning. We will have two sessions and divide the groups in half. While the students are with the teachers - Lynn, Jenn and Natalie will meet with the parents in the Music Room.

Graduation for Grade 6 will be on Friday, June $17^{\text {th }}$. The ceremony will take place - inperson - with parents in the gym in the morning. We will then have a lunch and an activity in the afternoon for the students.

Articulations for high school are beginning. We are preparing to meet and share information with the high schools about our Grade 6 students.

Natalie Maurice presented the results of the survey to the Governing Board. As well, Natalie Maurice went to all the classes who participated in the survey to follow up and
share results. This practice is very valuable to help better understand the data and to engage constructive conversations with the students. The teachers were also present.

### 6.8Five Year Plan - Fence

The five-year plan was shared with the Governing Board members. Natalie Maurice explained that the items on the list may not necessarily be taken care of within the five years as other priorities emerge from other schools and centers within the school board.

Continued discussion was had regarding potentially having a fence at Beacon Hill. Teachers and daycare voiced their concerns regarding the area by the parking lot.

Discussion continued regarding the pros and cons of having a fence either partially or around the school property.

Marilyne explained that this is something that can be put on the Five Year Plan - but can be removed at any time.

The discussion has been tabled to June.

### 6.9Subject Time Allocation

The subjects (specialist time) have not changed for the 2022-23 school year. The time assigned per release was standardized so that all students from Grade 1 - Grade 6 receive equal amounts of Drama, Music and Physical Education.

### 6.10Response for GB Funds

As clearly stated in the GB Manual, the GB expenses are for the GB's operating expenses.

At the beginning of each year, the governing board should decide how the budget will be used. The allocation is intended for operating expenses, such as: postage, photocopying, meeting refreshments, training materials, etc.

Participation on a governing board is of a voluntary nature. However, a governing board may decide to defray some baby-sitting or transportation costs if the need arises. This is a decision of the governing board and should be discussed early in the year. It is important that all members understand what expenses will be covered by this operating budget in order to avoid any misunderstanding later.
