4. Reports:

4.1 Principal

The office has been very busy preparing for next year. We came back from the holidays with Open House on January 17^{th} . Many thanks to Home and School, as well as the parent volunteers who came in to help make the event a success. We had approximately 30 - 40 families to date.

The re-registration period began on January 16th for siblings. High school registration for Grade 6 students started on January 23rd, as well for K4/K5 and new students. K4/K5, news students and re-registration period continued the week of January 30th – February 3rd.

The school library also opened on Monday, January 23rd. We were able to secure enough volunteers to cover the shifts that take place on Mondays and Thursdays. Each class will have the opportunity to visit the library once a week. They were very happy to return to the wonderful space and take out books.

January 20th was a school board-based PED day. The staff met and began discussions about the new Education Project for BH for 2034-24. The government is working on their direction – which is then passed to the school board – which is then passed to the school level – which is finally passed to the GB and the community at large. We take this process and make sure to give it the time and effort – it is a very important component of the school's direction. The staff (and daycare) will be involved in brainstorming and collaborative meetings to make sure that we are a cohesive and moving forward together.

February 10th was a professional development day for staff. We had to opportunity to hear a presentation from Dave Melnick.

Here is a brief description and a few points from the day:

Many students today arrive at school with unprecedented adversity due to high rates of traumatic stress, social isolation, and systemic inequities. Oftentimes our traditional methods of relationship building, discipline, and instruction fall short for these students, leaving educators strained, frustrated, and self-doubting. In this workshop, we will begin to study the harmful effects of trauma on students, their families, and on the workforce. We examine how traditional mindsets and beliefs systems can cause harm and even exacerbate the very conditions we are trying to address. Trauma Transformation is part of equity work, and we will begin to examine the impact of white supremacy, racism, and sociocultural trauma, as well as discrimination based on gender identity, sexual orientation, or ability and other types of traumas. The groundwork for Trauma Transformation begins with education about trauma including areas of impact, resilience factors and the context for healing and well-being. We will focus on an "Outcome Formula" designed to challenge conventional and traditional approaches to acting out and then begin to explore the "5 Key Practices" necessary for a trauma-informed workforce. These practices include Stress, Reflective Practices, Reframing, Relationality, and Co-Care.

The Kindness Committee has been busy planning events for school spirit. We have decided to have dress down dates every Wednesday leading up to the Easter Break.
